



## 2019 Class Structures & Placements

Class structure is heavily reliant on the number of students in each year level as this dictates the level of funding we receive to support this. We are fortunate to be able to align the majority of classes to the Australian Curriculum 2 year band subjects which make up 50% of the curriculum.

With the class structure determined, we have also adjusted the combination of year levels in each of the buildings. It is important to have teachers collaboratively working in teams and for children to have the opportunity to mix with a range of age groups. This re-organisation of year levels across the buildings will facilitate each of these goals. There will be some movement of children from the Torrens back to the Gorge building, this in no way reflects that we consider these children as 'junior primary' but in fact value them as role models and leaders. This will be important to discuss once class placement information is received.

Class placements have been finalised, with each class either at capacity or very near to it. The process of organising 455 children into 17 classes is complex, be assured that teachers have spent considerable time on ensuring that each class is the best it can be. Thank you for placing your trust in us to meet the social and learning needs of your child.

You will receive notice of your child's 2019 class with their reports next week. A class visit time is currently being organised. HR is still working on allocating staff to schools. We hope to be able to confirm all staff by the end of next week.

Once the team was selected we continued to attend daily training sessions (both in the morning and again at lunchtime/recess), we also had one morning each week dedicated to develop technique, skills, ball tracking, match awareness and most importantly, teamwork. The Ignite Program is a selective entry program for gifted students entering Year 8 at The Heights School. Within the Ignite program there are opportunities for students to be accelerated, and participate in a range of enrichment activities to extend and stimulate their adept minds. They study, and form friendships with other like-minded peers, in a caring and nurturing environment.

We continue to be one of the leading schools across the Northern Region, with outstanding SACE results. In 2016 our students achieved the highest SACE scores across the Northern Region, and we continued these great results last year. In 2017, 20% of our Stage 2 students received an ATAR score of over 80. 11% of these students scored above 90, with our highest achieving an ATAR score of 98.8.
